# Pre-Departure Timeline

## Friday, March 8

- ❖ Leave Home wherever you need to.
- ❖ Arrive at Airport at 5:00 AM SHARP
- ❖ Check-in – You will need your ID for this
- ❖ Flight Boards at 5:55 AM
- ❖ Flight Leaves at 6:25 AM



# Check-in Procedure

- ❖ Check-in with United Airlines
- ❖ You will need your photo ID for Check-in
- ❖ This is where you will pay for your checked bag – \$25
- ❖ You will get a boarding pass – put it in your shirt pocket
- ❖ Put your ID away for now



# TSA Requirements; 3-1-1 Brochure

- ❖ 3-ounce bottle or less
- ❖ 1-quart Ziploc bag
- ❖ 1-bag per person
- ❖ Less than 3 oz in a 10 oz bottle is a no-no
- ❖ Containers must be 3 oz or less
- ❖ Liquids, gels, aerosols
- ❖ Larger volumes in checked luggage



# TSA Guidelines – Dress the Part

- ❖ No heavy jewelry- pins, bolos; piercings, belt buckles, etc.
- ❖ No metal buttons, snaps or studs (regular jeans OK)
- ❖ No hidden items such as piercings (may be required to remove it)





# TSA Guidelines – Dress the Part


- ❖ TSA is required to positively identify any metal that is detected at a screening checkpoint.
- ❖ If you set off the alarm, you are going to get inspected **VERY** closely.
- ❖ Medical Implants (knees, hips, screws, plates)?
  - ❖ Stainless steel will require additional screening
  - ❖ Titanium plates OK ;-)



# TSA Guidelines – Carry-on Bag

## ❖ BEFORE YOU LEAVE HOME

- ❖ Make sure you have no liquids, creams or aerosols over 3 oz each in your carry-on
- ❖ Make sure they are in a 1-quart bag as required
- ❖ Make sure your pocket knife is **NOT** in your carry-on – put it in your checked bag



# Security Procedure – Before getting in line

- ❖ Take **EVERYTHING** out of your pockets
  - ❖ Put the stuff in your carry-on bag.
  - ❖ Your pockets should be absolutely empty
  - ❖ OK to put stuff in jacket pocket ‘cause you will be taking jacket off
- ❖ Make sure 3-1-1 bag is readily available




# Security Procedure – While in line

- ❖ Get out ID and Boarding Pass
- ❖ Loosen shoe laces as needed
- ❖ Show ID and Boarding Pass to TSA Agent
- ❖ Put ID Away – keep your boarding pass out and in your hand
- ❖ Watch the people in line in front of you to see what is going on



# Security Procedure – At Checkpoint #1

- ❖ Get a bin
- ❖ Take off shoes, put on the table in front of the conveyor belt – NOT IN THE BIN
- ❖ Take off jacket, put in bin
- ❖ Put hat in bin on top of jacket
- ❖ Take off belt put in bin
- ❖ Place 3-1-1 bag in bin – separate bin as needed
- ❖ Place carry-on bag on table behind your bin



## Security Procedure – At Checkpoint #2

- ❖ Move your stuff along table and into scanner
- ❖ Wait to enter body scanner until directed by TSA Agent
- ❖ When directed enter scanner and assume the position – boarding pass in hand – stand still
- ❖ Wait until told to proceed and get your stuff
- ❖ If requested, follow Agent for additional screening



## Security Procedure – At Checkpoint #3

- ❖ Recover items on far side of scanner
- ❖ Gather up your stuff and move away from Checkpoint to nearby chairs
- ❖ Re-assemble yourself
- ❖ **DO NOT GET DRESSED AT THE CHECKPOINT**
- ❖ Hang out until we are all through the process



# Security Procedure – At Checkpoint #4

- ❖ Be QUIET
- ❖ Be RESPECTFUL
- ❖ ANSWER ALL QUESTIONS TRUTHFULLY
- ❖ NO JOKING AROUND
- ❖ Attempting to take prohibited items through security is a crime and is punishable by law.
- ❖ If you get detained because of something you have, said, or did, you are on your own. I cannot help you.





# Prohibited Carry-on Items – Partial List

- ❖ Anything sharp or pointed
  - ❖ Multi-tools – most have a blade
  - ❖ Liquids, creams or aerosols greater than 3 oz bottle
  - ❖ Butane or propane lighters
  - ❖ Shoe gel inserts
  - ❖ Most tools, including screwdrivers and wrenches
- ❖ Guns, ammunition, explosives, axes, swords, etc.
- ❖ Pop, coffee, bottles of water, etc.



# Allowed Carry-on Items – Partial List

- ❖ Thing you might wonder about
  - ❖ Safety razors
  - ❖ Scissors with blades shorter than 4 inches – but be prepared to answer questions and may lose them
  - ❖ Dry food items



# Checked luggage – Partial List

## ❖ Prohibited

- ❖ Most things you cannot bring anyway

  - ❖ Guns, swords, explosives, fireworks, etc.

- ❖ ANY Li-Ion batteries

- ❖ Batteries not in original container

- ❖ Anything flammable or pressurized, including matches and lighters

- ❖ Allowed – Limited quantities of toiletries, including aerosols

- ❖ NOTE - Any sharp objects in checked baggage should be sheathed or securely wrapped to prevent injury to baggage handlers and inspectors.



# Electronics Discussion

- ❖ Game boys, iPods, portable DVD Players, etc.
  - ❖ OK for travel, put them away when we get to Camp
  - ❖ This is like any other Scout Camp
- ❖ I will have a laptop to download your pictures if your digital camera gets full



# Electronics Discussion

## ❖ Cell Phones

- ❖ Youth do not need them – leave them home
- ❖ Adults – go well away from group if you NEED to have a conversation
- ❖ Tell everyone that you will not be able to take calls
- ❖ Change your greeting to say to are on Maui and not available to take any calls
- ❖ Remember 4-5 hour time difference – you may get calls at 4 AM unless you turn off/silence your phone.



# Electronics Discussion

- ❖ Keep your “HOME” information to yourself
- ❖ Cars are cell-free zones
- ❖ One person yakking is one too many
- ❖ Obviously, no cell usage by drivers



# Electronics Discussion - Photos

- ❖ No photos of persons are to be posted anywhere. Period.
- ❖ Do not take embarrassing or revealing photos
  - ❖ If you would not want your MOM to see it...
- ❖ Take lots of photos of the group and scenery
- ❖ We will download each evening for safekeeping



# Communications Protocols

for the folks at home

- ❖ No NEWS is GOOD NEWS
- ❖ Do not expect to hear from us
- ❖ We do not expect to hear from you
- ❖ Do not call us with local news





# Clothing Considerations – In Flight

- ❖ Class A
- ❖ No neckware
- ❖ Socks
- ❖ Shoes (I am wearing Crocs and they are the only shoes I am taking along)
- ❖ Trip hat or other Scout hat
- ❖ Long pants (zip-offs?)
- ❖ Jewelry – might want to leave it all at home; rings, etc.



# Packing Considerations – In Flight

- ❖ Shorts to change into – hot when we get there
- ❖ Electronics
  - ❖ There are no power ports on the airplane, so bring extra batteries
  - ❖ If you have a favorite set of earbuds or a headset, bring it for the on-board movie
- ❖ Book
- ❖ Gameboy, iPod, Portable DVD player, etc
- ❖ Cribbage Board & Cards – Tournament???



# In Flight

- ❖ Follow all instructions immediately – pay attention to the safety briefing.
- ❖ Be considerate of those around you.
- ❖ Look out the window!
- ❖ If you need to use the rest room, put your shoes on. The rest-rooms sometimes get pretty nasty.
- ❖ Take a nap!



# Stuff to get while there

- ❖ Film – obviously only if you have a re-loadable film camera
- ❖ Extra batteries (AA, AAA, etc)
- ❖ Sunscreen
- ❖ Aloha Shirt for Luau
- ❖ Sunburn (suntan??)
- ❖ Postcards to send home?
- ❖ Hula dancer girl for the dash of your car?



## While we are there....

- ❖ Class B Shirts almost anytime we are away from Camp. Exceptions:
  - ❖ On flying days – Class A
  - ❖ To Luau – Aloha Shirt or Maui T-Shirt
  - ❖ In the water – DUH!
- ❖ Have at least one Class B for non-beach times – beach Class B's will get salty and crusty.



# Carry-on Bags

- ❖ Max 40lbs
- ❖ Need to be of certain size
- ❖ I will have a scale to weigh them next meeting.
